



In 2017 we celebrate the **12-th anniversary** of the International Conference on Critical (Information) Infrastructures Security. Call for Papers

Main topics: Cyber Security; Human Factors; Transport; Emergency Management; Urban Resilience; Trust and Information Sharing; Methods, Analyses & Models. Beside these main sectors, any scientific improvement in the field of security and protection of our complex society is eligible.

Papers submitted via **EasyChair** must be formatted using the LNCS Springer template and will be double blind reviewed. For poster contributions, submission can be limited to an extended abstract. All accepted contributions will be included in full length in the pre-proceedings that will appear at the time of the conference; accepted papers are planned to be published in the LNCS Springer-Verlag series.

YCA: Young Critis Award. Along the line of the CRITIS tradition, special attention will be devoted to young talents. To this purpose, a price will be awarded to the best contribution presented by a young author.
